

Strengthening CSOs as Catalysts of Livelihood Opportunities and Development






Project Sashakt aims to build the capacity of women handloom cooperatives in Assam and to enable them to act as independent actors in promoting and facilitating economic security for women weavers associated with the cooperatives.

Project Duration: January 2025-January 2028

## **Operational Area**

Three districts of Assam: Chirang, Dhubri and Kamrup





## **Target Group**

- 25 handloom cooperative societies
- 2,500 women artisans from low-income households, including indigenous tribes, Affirmative Action groups and minorities
- Banks and financial institutions, local Civil Society Organisations (CSOs), relevant government departments

#### **Project Rationale**

- Assam's per capita income is estimated to be lowest in the North-East region. It is ranked 24th in terms of human development and gender equality
- Highest proportion of weavers in India can be seen in Assam and around 90% of them are women
- Low support from cooperatives, lack of technical skills for quality production, poor financial management skills, limited access to government schemes and difficulties accessing larger markets are the hurdles faced by the women weavers in the handloom sector



## **Project Model**

Humana People to People India through Project Sashakt strives to create an entrepreneurial ecosystem in the handloom sector in Assam which can be best explained through LEED or Local Entrepreneurship Ecosystem Development approach.
