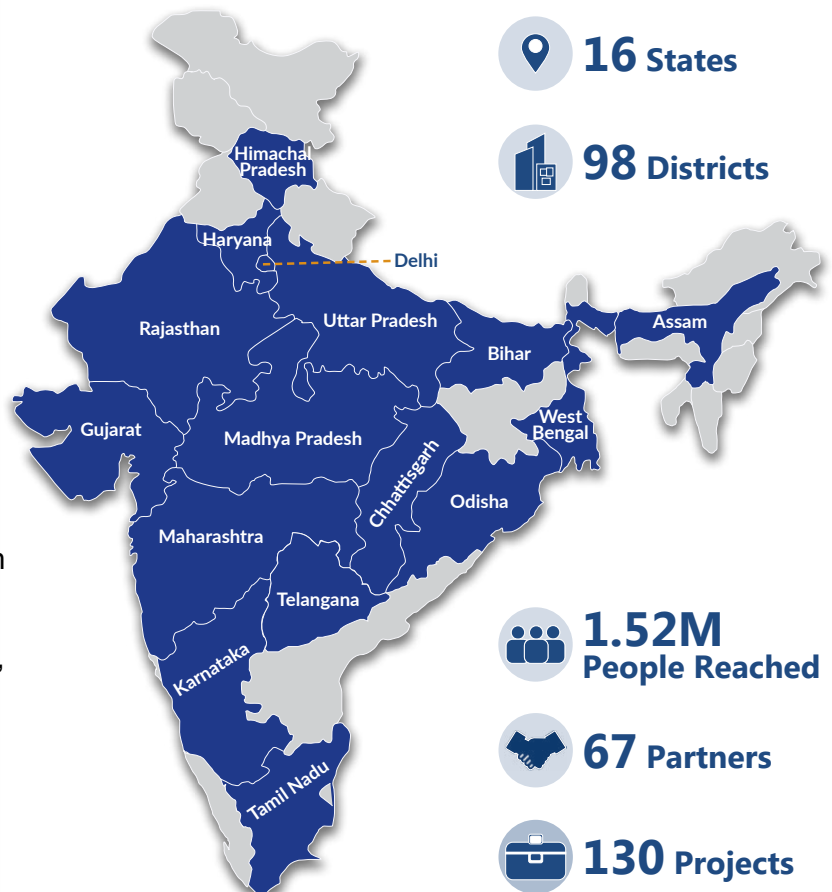


About Us

Humana People to People India (HPPI) is a development organisation, registered since 1998. We work with people in rural and urban communities to strengthen knowledge, skills and capacities and together create pathways towards better lives and greater self-reliance.

Our work spans in the area of Education, Health, Livelihood, Environment and Community Development. In 2025–26, HPPI implemented 130 projects across 16 states and 98 districts, reaching 1.52 million people.

Our programmes are rooted in participation, collective action and locally led solutions, working closely with communities, government institutions and development partners to build resilient communities and a more equitable and sustainable society.



Education

HPPI works to advance equitable access to quality education, especially for children and youth from marginalised communities. Our inclusive education programmes use participatory and holistic approaches that help learners build knowledge, develop agency and strengthen their confidence.

- **The Kadam Programme** is an HPPI initiative to collaborate with government schools to provide an engaging and effective learning environment for school children. It supports out-of-school children to transition into formal education and helps in-school children bridge learning gaps and continue their education.
- **The Necessary Teacher Training (NeTT) Programme** strengthens pre-service teacher education in government-run institutions through learner-driven and practice-oriented methodologies, while supporting DIETs as centres of excellence. The NeTT Programme equips the student-teachers with classroom readiness, reflective teaching practices and child-centred approaches to improve the overall quality of school education.
- **Promoting Equal Learning Opportunities for Girls**
We support adolescents, especially girls, through academic assistance, life skills, health awareness and personal development.

Health

HPPI supports national health priorities through community-based interventions that improve access to healthcare, strengthen the resilience of vulnerable populations and promote healthier, more informed communities. Our work addresses tuberculosis, HIV and AIDS, non-communicable diseases and community health, with a focus on women and children.

- **Tuberculosis:** We work with vulnerable and marginalised communities in close cooperation with the National Tuberculosis Elimination Program (NTEP) to promote awareness, early detection, referral, treatment adherence and access to care, including support for people with drug-resistant TB.
- **HIV/AIDS:** Through community-based prevention, testing, referral and care services, HPPI works with vulnerable and high-risk populations in partnership with the State AIDS Control Societies.
- **Community Health & Non-Communicable Diseases:** We promote health awareness, screening and access to services, including women's health, nutrition and prevention of non-communicable diseases. We support Anganwardi Centers, women health groups and work together with local health centers to strengthen their capacity.

Environment

Climate change is increasingly affecting India's environment, agriculture and livelihoods. HPPI works alongside communities to strengthen resilience through sustainable agriculture, tree plantation, ecoliteracy, renewable energy and responsible textile reuse.

- **Holistic Rural Development:** Farmers' Groups promote chemical-free and climate-resilient farming, improving soil health, reducing input costs and strengthening food and livelihood security.
- **Tree Plantation and Ecoliteracy:** School children, communities and partners participate in plantation drives, Eco Clubs and pesticide-free nutritional gardens.
- **Biogas:** HPPI promotes family-sized biogas plants that provide clean energy, improve sanitation and support healthier rural households.
- **Reuse and Circularity:** HPPI collects second-hand clothing and extends its lifecycle through resale and reuse, generating both environmental and social values. The initiative also contributes to lowering the overall carbon footprint across the textile value chain.

Livelihood

Sustainable livelihoods are essential for reducing poverty, strengthening resilience and creating pathways towards inclusive development. HPPI supports women, youths, farmers, artisans and other vulnerable groups with knowledge, skills, confidence and resources to improve their economic well-being and achieve greater self-reliance.

- **Supporting Women to become Entrepreneurs:** Women are supported to identify business opportunities, develop business plans, strengthen production and access markets.
- **Financial and Digital Literacy:** Training in financial planning, online banking, digital payments, e-commerce and business record-keeping builds confidence to participate in an increasingly digital economy.
- **Digital Entrepreneurship:** Women are enabled to use digital tools and platforms to start and grow enterprises, expand market access and improve business visibility and income opportunities.
- **Farm-based Livelihoods & Producer Groups:** Farmers' Groups and producer collectives promote sustainable and climate-resilient agriculture, crop diversification, water conservation, livestock and other farm-based enterprises.

Community Development

Strong and resilient communities are the foundation of sustainable development. HPPI's Community Development framework, rooted in the People-to-People philosophy, supports local democracy and grassroots action by bringing communities together to create solutions.

Our interventions integrate education, health, sustainable livelihoods, waste management and access to civic services. We work with Village Panchayats, community groups, women's and youth groups and underserved urban settlements to strengthen local ownership and build pathways towards self-reliance.

• Integrated Urban Community Development:

Community-driven interventions address healthcare, education, livelihoods, sanitation, waste management and access to government entitlements.

• **Model Village Development:** HPPI works with Gram Panchayats to strengthen education, health, digital skills, infrastructure, safe drinking water, sanitation, environmental action and access to government schemes.

• **Children with Special Needs:** We support children with disabilities through early identification, individualised support, family engagement, school-based interventions and linkages with government services.
